

ABOUT TRINITY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

Trinity Christian School (TCS) is an independent, K-12, interdenominational Christian school that is located on a twenty-five-acre campus and sits just southwest of Washington, D.C., in the heart of Fairfax County, Virginia. Trinity Christian School was designated a National Blue Ribbon K-12 Private School in 2019.

TCS is a community of believers in Jesus Christ who desire to raise their children in the historic Christian faith. The school seeks to impart truth, which is the Word of God, written and Incarnate; instill character, which is the courage to live the truth of God's Word uncompromisingly in a compromising age; and inspire service, which is the imitation of Christ.

The goal at TCS is to see God's image manifest in each of the students so they walk humbly with God in their minds, love mercy in their hearts, and act justly in their lives. The school seeks excellence for mind and heart by presenting excellence to its students through academic rigor, spiritual vitality, and living together in community. Each student's calling at this time in his or her life is to be a student and to diligently pursue the knowledge of "wisdom and instruction, to understand words of insight, to receive instruction in wise dealing, in righteousness, justice, and equity; to give prudence to the simple, knowledge and discretion to the youth –" (Proverbs 1:2-4).

TCS is fully accredited by the Virginia Council for Private Education (VCPE) and Cognia. Recent insights from the March 2022 Cognia accreditation review revealed that:



SCHOOL HISTORY AND CAMPUS DETAIL

TCS opened in 1987 with 41 students in grades one through three, three full-time teachers, and two full-time staff in space provided by Truro Church. Shortly thereafter, a second campus was added at Providence Presbyterian Church to accommodate 118 students in grades one through five. Over the next ten years, TCS continued to grow, reaching 300 students in grades one through ten on four separate campuses. Generous giving then allowed for the school to purchase the twenty-five-acre site on which the TCS campus now resides. In 2003, TCS opened the doors to the first building at the new campus facility on Braddock Road with 450 students and more than 50 faculty and staff members.

Today, with an annual operating budget of \$12.35M and more than 100 full and part-time employees, TCS serves a robust and diverse student body of 750 students who worship within 34 different denominations. Campus facilities include a Lower School with 17 classrooms, one science classroom and a library, and an Upper School with 23 classrooms, 4 science classrooms, one Harkness Table classroom, a media center, and a computer lab. TCS also has a student support services suite, a 1000-seat gymnasium, one stage, two turf athletic fields, and one playground.

The school has also purchased property one mile west of the current TCS campus and has begun exploring development possibilities. As enrollment has continued to grow, the school has reached maximum capacity at its Braddock Road campus and is looking toward this property as potentially housing an expanded Upper School program, performing arts center, and additional athletics fields.



ACADEMICS

Biblical integration happens in academics across the Lower and Upper Schools.

Lower School (K-6)

Core subjects are taught at every grade level: Christian Studies, mathematics, history, language arts, and science. Art, music, and physical education are included in every student's schedule and chapel services are conducted twice each month. Field trips and special projects also supplement the Lower School program.

Students have two years to prepare for the transition to the Upper School through introduction to higher-level thinking skills as well as organizational tools. With "Classroom in a Box," teachers enhance lessons and build research skills as students use tablets and laptops in the classroom.





Upper School (7-12)

Trinity offers a college-preparatory curriculum where emphasis is not only on teaching content, but also on developing lifelong learners who are adept at reading, writing, and reasoning. Advanced Placement and/or honors courses are offered in many departments and teaching methods in the Upper School incorporate oral presentations, drama, papers, speeches, debates, worldview discussion, critical thinking, and guided research with the goal of synthesizing ideas (leading to the composition and defense of the senior thesis).

Senior Thesis

At TCS, the Bible isn't just the focus of Christian Studies classes. God's Word permeates the arts, the extracurriculars, even the athletics programs. The school strives to see the world filtered through the lens of Jesus Christ. TCS is a safe place where students learn about God, wrestle with life's questions, and build a solid foundation for their Christian faith.

The capstone of that foundation is a <u>Senior Thesis</u>, a yearlong project that prepares students to confidently defend their faith in the world outside of TCS. Throughout the Senior Thesis project, students dig deeper and articulate their own beliefs about different aspects of Christianity. After putting their findings into a 15-20 page paper, students defend their theses orally before a formal panel of faculty and administrators. The goal is to ensure that TCS graduates not only know what they believe but are able to defend it in the face of critical scrutiny.

Student Support Services

A long-held vision for TCS was the development of a Learning Center designed to serve students with learning differences. Launched in 2014, the Learning Center, housed within <u>The Gryphon's LAIR (Learning Assistance and Institutional Resources)</u>, began supporting students, parents, and faculty. Using CTP test scores and teacher referrals, students were identified with possible learning challenges requiring educational support through scaffolded intervention programs to close the achievement gap.

The LAIR houses a variety of services for students at all grade levels. The large open space provides tables for small group study or instruction, as well as private carrels with windows for tutoring or confidential discussions with students or parents. Services include:

- Executive Functioning (EF) Services
- Robust Accommodations Plans
- English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)
- NILD (National Institution for Learning Development) Therapy

College Advising

Actively engaged in counseling students and their parents, beginning in the freshman year, the College Advisors offer college planning seminars as well as one-on-one advising for the entire college search and application process. The College Advisors cultivate and maintain relationships with college admissions representatives, who visit Trinity's campus regularly throughout the school year to meet students. Juniors receive thorough individual preparation for applying to college, from compiling resumes to requesting teacher recommendations. VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

The Fine Arts program at TCS begins in Lower School with weekly music instruction in a dedicated space, culminating in semi-annual performances. Beginning band, strings, and chorus are available after school as well. Twice weekly visual arts classes introduce students to the language of art through art history, critiques, and experiencing several techniques and media. Upper School performing arts offers band, strings, chorus, and theater classes at the intermediate, advanced, and honors levels. Instrumental and choral ensembles perform for the school and community multiple times throughout the year. Musical skills are cultivated through exposure and repertoire performance in varying styles and genres.

The Visual Arts Program offers classes focused on Drawing, 2D Design and 3D Design. Required visual journaling allows students to develop their voice through artmaking. Award-winning students in AP Studio Art classes prepare and submit portfolios to national organizations such as Scholastic Art Awards and the College Board.

ATHLETICS

Pursuing excellence for mind and heart, both on and off the field.

TCS is a member of the Virginia Christian Athletic Conference (VCAC) and has 36 teams competing in 16 sports through three seasons across the Middle School, Junior Varsity, and Varsity levels.

STUDENT LIFE

Students at TCS have the opportunity to participate in a large variety of <u>clubs and extracurricular activities</u>. The school has 25 clubs and student organizations providing every student the opportunity to make connections with like-minded students. These student organizations foster learning, complement Trinity's balanced curriculum, and offer students access to skills built outside their regular classrooms.

HEAD OF SCHOOL TRANSITION

After leading Trinity Christian School for seventeen years, Dr. David Vanderpoel has announced he will be stepping down from the Head of School role. Dr. Vanderpoel, who became Trinity Christian School's fourth Head of School in 2005, will serve in his current capacity through July 31, 2023. Dr. Vanderpoel's tenure is the longest of the school's four leaders and under his watch, total enrollment has grown from 450 to 750 students, student diversity increased significantly, a second academic building opened with 47,000 square feet of Upper School classrooms, and a performing arts wing and 1,000-seat gymnasium were also constructed.

"This year marks Trinity's 35th anniversary, and it is time for the school to transition to new leadership that will commit itself to the development of our Shirley Gate property. At the conclusion of the 2022-23 school year, I will have served for 18 years as Head of School, 20 years on the Board of Trustees, and our family's involvement in Trinity will span 25 years. These have been the most rewarding years of my life, and I cherish all of you and this community more than words can express."

HEAD OF SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES


To be effective, the TCS Head of School must also:

- Be the face of TCS to the external Fairfax community and participate in key community events and organizations.
- Build partnerships with other like-minded schools, churches, parachurch ministries, organizations, corporations, and municipalities to further common goals.
- Encourage accountability and participate in, as appropriate, professional development opportunities.
- Promote and sustain efforts to attract and retain a qualified and diverse faculty, staff, and student body.
- Affirm the value of faculty and staff; collaborate with and invest in them personally and in their professional development.
